


Greenways are communication routes reserved exclusively for non-motorised journeys, developed in an integrated manner which enhances both the environment and quality of life of the surrounding area.

These routes should meet satisfactory standards of width, gradient, and surface condition to ensure that they are both user-friendly and low-risk for users of all abilities. In this respect, canal towpaths and disused railway lines are a highly suitable resource for the development of greenways.

Railway map of Latvia, 1934 / RailwayMuseum.lv




Infrastructure development plans of Latvian Railways / LR, 2022




- Hundreds ok kms of abandoned / overgrown trails / some used for illegal driving / forestry works / garbage
- Unclear / divided land ownership issues ("belongs to no-one, sand, gravel, metal can be "taken", paths were obstructed by farmers, nearby companies etc.)
- Unclear / divided land ownership issues ("belongs to no-one")
- Many former railway stations in very bad shape, collapsing (belonging to State Railways)
- Dangerous sections within the route (mostly former railway bridges)
- Abandoned rails in some sections without any use
- Some parts preserved by locals, including railway heritage (e.g. buildings, bridges, former railway artefacts)
- Some municipalities already had signed agreement with railway authority

Additional measures – reflective elements






Setting-up new wooden bridges (instead of the former iron)

Suntaži former railway station > Design Hotel (Aug. 2023)








Creating favorable conditions for (potential) entrepreneurs nearby:

- Included in the promotional materials (maps, mini-maps, articles etc.)








Activities for the future: better connection with public transportation, more safe and accessible greenways

Near-future plans regarding greenways development in Latvia

- Greenways network further development in Vidzeme, Kurzeme and South Estonia regions
 - Emphasis on accessability improvements, but also new sections (EstLat, approved)
- Urban Mobility connection improvements (Interreg Europe, under assessment)
- Urban Mobility Lighthouse site as an initiative of the European Commission, under DG MOVE
- Local development initiatives by the communities (e.g. through LEADER) enthusiasts and entrepreneurs
- Cooperation with European Greenways Assoc., incl. policy advocacy via European Parliament resolution of 25 March 2021 on establishing an EU strategy for sustainable tourism (2020/2038(INI)) – Rail Trails
